## BUILDING RESILIENT COMMUNITIES THROUGH COMMUNITY-BASED FOREST MANAGEMENT

Hosted by NORDIK Institute and the Northern Ontario Sustainable Communities Partnership

January 16-18, 2013, Algoma University, Sault Ste. Marie, Ontario, Canada

**Objectives:** This conference is about community-based forest management (CBFM) research, practice and policy to promote resilience in forest-based communities. The conference will: 1) provide a forum for the advancement of CBFM as a new forest management model in Canada and 2) spearhead the formation of a pan-Canadian CBFM network of research, practice and knowledge mobilization.

**Intended Participants**: CBFM practitioners and researchers, students, environmental NGOs, First Nations and Métis, unions, forest industry and government representatives, and the general public with an interest in CBFM.

**Program Format**: Formal presentations by a government representative, researchers and practitioners and interactive discussions, including a "talking circle" to share experiences about CBFM. The conference will be live-streamed and electronically archived.

**Book Launch:** Jan. 16: Ryan Bullock and Kevin Hanna's Community Forestry: Local Values, Conflict and Forest Governance (Cambridge University Press, 2012).

**Pre-Conference Tour:** Jan. 16, Sault Ste Marie: Government forest research facilities and celebration of Shingwauk, Anishinaabe Chief and signatory to the 1850 Robinson-Huron Treaty.

**Graduate Student Funding:** Available for eligible graduate students undertaking research related to community-based forest management, based on application that includes abstract of poster. Please inquire about applying.
